Gloria Williams Park Grand Re-Opening

Over the past 12 months, Gloria Williams Park has undergone significant renovations, including:

- Basketball Court: Repaired and resurfaced with new backboards and rims.
- ADA-Compliant Trails: New trails connecting the basketball court to the pool and the new playground.
- Park Amenities: Refurbished pergola and picnic areas within the pool area, a refurbished pump room and lifeguard area, and a new self-leveling compound joint on the pool deck.
- Playground: A brand-new playground with safety surfacing.
- Additional Features: Two new picnic tables, a new park sign, and drought-tolerant grass.

These upgrades, which cost approximately \$130,000, excluding pipes and street department infrastructure, were necessary not only due to a previous motor vehicle accident, but also because the previous pool was over 60 years old, and the basketball court and playground were over 25 years old. The entire park redesign was handled by the Rockwall Parks and Recreation staff. Many of Mrs. Williams' family members were able to join in celebration of her past contributions to the City.



TxDOT's next major projects in Rockwall include the construction of a new half of the Horizon Rd bridge, followed by the removal and replacement of the existing side. Once completed, this will expand the bridge to feature three lanes in each direction, two Uturn lanes, and sidewalks on both sides, significantly improving traffic flow and pedestrian access. The Horizon Road interchange is scheduled to complete in late 2026. Additionally, updates to the Ridge Road bridge are planned, which may necessitate nighttime closures. Residents should also anticipate various lane closures on the I-30 frontage roads as TxDOT prepares these areas for expansion and drainage improvements.

As progress continues, check <u>drivetexas.org</u> for daily lane closures. The work is part of TxDOT's "Texas Clear Lanes" effort to relieve congestion in major metropolitan areas.

As fall approaches, it's time to prioritize gutter care and lawn/landscape maintenance to keep homes in top condition. Start by thoroughly cleaning your gutters to remove leaves, twigs, and other debris that can cause blockages and lead to water damage. Inspect gutters and downspouts for any signs of damage, such as cracks or leaks, and make necessary repairs to ensure efficient drainage.

For your lawn, early fall is the ideal time to fertilize with a balanced fertilizer such as a 20-5-10, promoting strong root growth to help your grass withstand the winter months and thrive in the spring. Fall is also the time to apply pre-emergent to prevent winter weeds such as annual Bluegrass, Henbit, and Dandelions, and it is important to make this application during the first couple of weeks of October before they germinate as soil temperatures drop.

For your landscapes and gardens, fall provides an excellent opportunity to plant cool-season vegetables like broccoli and lettuce as well as hardy winter annual color such as Pansies and Violas that do well during our harsh winters. By mulching your flower beds, you can retain soil moisture, regulate temperature, and suppress weeds, ensuring a healthy and vibrant landscape and garden throughout the season.
